AES Engineers

Eligibility: SENIOR: planning on attending post-secondary school in the fall.

Procedures: Submit essay between 500 - 100 words, via email ESSAY topic-When you look back on your life in 30 years, what would it take for you to consider your life successful? What relationships or accomplishments will be important on this journey? Include your name and the name of your high school. You are not required to be taking Engineering courses to be eligible.

Eligibility: SENIOR planning to attend WSU. You must let your counselor know early that you wish to be considered. This is a nomination scholarship. Use the eligibility calculator on the scholarship website to see if you are eligible. 3.0 minimum GPA, academic achievement, community service and references are required. The Career Center or your Counselor and help you with the calculator. Counselor nominations are due 10/19!

Procedures: See your counselor early to let them know that you are interested in being considered for this scholarship. Cannot be combined with UAA or National Merit award.

P.E.O. STAR Scholarship

Eligibility: JUNIORS: WOMEN begin application Junior Year, finish Nov. of Senior Year. Applicants are Woman who: Exhibits excellence in leadership, academics, extracurricular activities, community service and potential for future success. Is in the final academic year (senior year) of her secondary education. Has a minimum cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.0. Is a citizen or legal permanent resident of the US or Canada. Plans to attend an accredited postsecondary educational institution in the US or Canada, full-time or part-time, in the fall of the academic year following high school graduation. Is recommended by and receives the vote of a local P.E.O. chapter

Procedures: Submission of the chapter recommendation form and chapter recommendation letter (thoroughly introducing the applicant and explaining her outstanding qualities and achievements) must be made online between September 1 and November 1.

Eligibility: 9-12 grades, has taken part in community service activities for the past year.

(Mrs. Kelly at BHS, Mrs. O'Brien at SQHS, Mrs. Zender at SHS) Complete any required supplemental forms issued by the Career Center at your high school. Each deserving applicant receives a certificate; only one student is selected from each school to compete at the state level.

AXA Achievement Scholarship - U.S. News & World Report

Eligibility: SENIOR, demonstrated ambition and self-drive as evidenced by an outstanding achievement in an activity in school, the community, or the workplace. One senior selected from each state. Must be US citizens or legal residents.

Procedures: Comprehensive application. In addition to listing of activities, awards, etc., applicants are asked to describe in detail an outstanding achievement they have accomplished in a non-academic activity or project. See application for details. For every student who wins a scholarship a \$1,000 grant will be awarded to their high school.

AXA Achievement Community Scholarship

Eligibility: SENIOR, US citizen or legal resident. The more applicants the more chances of winning! Plan of full time enrollment in a 2 or 4-year college/university in the fall after graduation.

Procedures: Must be ambitious and motivated, as evidenced by outstanding achievement in school, community, or work activities, and be recommended by an unrelated adult who can attest to the student's achievement. Applicants will describe an outstanding long-term achievement they have accomplished in a non-academic activity or project. Only 10,000 applications will be accepted.

Procedures: Submit essay- no longer than 5 paragraphs and 600 words- clearly describe your life before and after the accident

Eligibility: SENIOR, Academic Achievement (3.0), Community Service, and Sports Activity.

Procedures: Application in Career Center. Recommendations, copy of transcript, completed application. One girl and one boy selected from all of Whatcom County. The two scholarships awarded are in the amount of \$8,000 (\$2,000 per year for four years).

Deadline: 1/15/2019 Amount: \$100-\$25,000

Eligibility: SENIOR: This scholarship is for students who are entering the emergency medical field, medical field, fire sciences or fire service. Preference is given to students who are related to a current member in good standing of IAFF(International Association of Fire Fighters) L10

Procedures: 2 letters of recommendation required, short paragraph answers to questions regarding planned career field, career goals, interests out of school, special skills and talents and why you should be selected for this scholarship. Official high school transcript required.

Deadline: 3/10/2019 Amount: \$2,500

Ewing C. Kelly Scholarship

Eligibility: SENIOR: Designed to reward students who demonstrate good citizenship while striving to attain their academic goals. Judged on academic merit, extra-curricular achievements-both scholastically and in the community. Applicant must be accepted, or have an application pending, at an accredited institution of higher learning, public or private, including community college. If planning on a 4-yr college must have a composite score of 20 on the ACT or a composite score of 1030 on SAT. Must be a US citizen or have green card.

Procedures: This is a general scholarship that can be used at any 2 or 4-yr. College. Application is on-line or in hardcopy available from the Career Center. Last year over 500 applications were judged and 52 awards were given!
